ARTISSIMA 2024 PRIZES AND FUNDS AT THE FAIR

Artissima presents eleven prizes and two funds for artists and galleries in collaboration with partner companies, art institutions and foundations.

31 October 2024 | Preview 1-2-3 November 2024 | Open to the public

Artissima organizes, in collaboration with its partners, art institutions and foundations, 11 prizes, one acquisition fund and one fund for galleries.

The 2024 edition presents an important new development, with the creation of the Orlane per l'Arte Prize, sponsored by Orlane, one of the world's most renowned luxury cosmetics brands. In addition, the historic Acquisitions Fund organized by Fondazione per l'Arte Moderna e Contemporanea CRT has been increase to 280,000 euros. The acquisitions benefit the collections of GAM - Galleria Civica di Arte Moderna di Torino and Castello di Rivoli Museo d'Arte Contemporanea.

The new edition also continues with the Artissima New Entries Fund, to provide financial support for three galleries of New Entries.

Finally, the promoters of ten historical and younger awards continue to reaffirm their ongoing support for

Four prizes are awarded in collaboration with partner companies: the illy Present Future Prize, organized by illycaffé since 2001; the VANNI occhiali #artistroom Prize, organized by VANNI occhiali since 2021; the Tosetti Value Photography Award, sponsored by Tosetti Value - II Family office since 2020; the Orlane per l'Arte Prize, presented by Orlane for the first time this year.

Two awards commemorate outstanding figures in the art world: the Matteo Viglietta Award, promoted by Collezione La Gaia since 2022; the Carol Rama Award, promoted by Fondazione Sardi per l'Arte since 2020. Five institutional grants for artists and galleries are organized by foundations and institutions: the Premio Diana Bracco - Imprenditrici ad Arte, created in 2023 and organized by Fondazione Bracco in collaboration with Fondazione Roberto De Silva & Diana Bracco of Milano; the Premio Pista 500, created in 2023 in collaboration with Pinacoteca Agnelli; the Oelle - Mediterraneo Antico Prize, sponsored since 2022 by the namesake Foundation of Catania; the "ad occhi chiusi..." Prize, established in 2021 in collaboration with Fondazione Merz; the Ettore & Ines Fico Prize, organized by MEF Museo Ettore Fico in Torino since 2010.

The prizes will be awarded by international juries during the fair, which takes place from 1 to 3 November 2024.

THE PRIZES

The illy Present Future Prize, produced in collaboration with illycaffè, has been awarded for the last 24 years to an artist participating in the curated section Present Future, which has long been a platform for the discovery of new talents. VANNI occhiali, the Torino-based brand of creative eyewear operating in over 40 countries around the world, reaffirms its support for Artissima, which began in 2019 with the capsule collection by Cristian Chironi. The brand presents the third edition of the VANNI occhiali #artistroom Prize, continuing its exploration of the synergy between contemporary art and eyewear design. At the fair, the prize aims to select the artist – thanks to a jury of multi-sectorial experts - whose research offers an original perspective on reality, evoking an unexpected and surprising gaze, much like looking through a lens. The winner will receive a cash prize of 2,500 euros and will also have the opportunity to design a limited-edition capsule collection of eyewear. The new capsule collection created by the 2023 prize winner, Elisa Alberti from Krobath gallery, Vienna, will be showcased during Artissima 2024 at the VANNI showroom in Piazza Carlina in Torino.

The Tosetti Value Award for photography, launched in 2020, is celebrating its fifth edition this year. The prize establishes a dialogue with "Perspectives. The economy of images", a contemporary photography project that began in 2014 and is curated by Tosetti Value per l'Arte. This initiative aims to foster discussion and reflection on our globalized world through exhibitions and talks, in synergy with the economic research conducted by Family office.

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An international jury of experts will select the artist whose photographic work is deemed particularly insightful for understanding the historical, social, and economic context of our globalized world. The winning artist, besides receiving a cash award of 2,500 euros, will have the opportunity to develop a project –following a process outlined by Tosetti Value – in dialogue with "Perspectives. The economy of images" during 2025. As part of this project, one work will be acquired for the Corporate Collection of Family office.

The 2024 edition introduces an important new development with the creation of the **Orlane per l'Arte Prize**, sponsored by Orlane, a renowned luxury cosmetics brand. The prize of 10,000 euros is designed to support the research and entrepreneurial activity of one of the galleries taking part at Artissima. An international jury of curators will select the gallery that exemplifies the highest standards of care and balance in presenting artists and their works.

Founded in 1947 in France, Orlane intertwines history, innovation and luxury in its DNA, celebrating art by recognizing the commitment of galleries in promoting the creative talent of artists.

THE HONOURS

The **Matteo Viglietta Award**, coordinated by **Collezione La Gaia** and now in its third edition, was established in 2022 to commemorate **Matteo Viglietta**, a passionate collector with a strong connection to Artissima since its inception. He actively supported the fair through acquisitions for his own collection and by organizing collateral events, with the exhibition space of Collezione La Gaia at Busca — founded with his partner Bruna Girodengo in the late 1970s — becoming one the most frequently visited locations.

The Viglietta family seeks to pay tribute to the joyful and curious spirit that characterized Viglietta's confident strides and insatiable appetite for art as he navigated the fair. He was always interested in the discovery and rediscovery of radical practices, often overlooked in terms of audience and market success. This award reflects Viglietta's longstanding tradition of selecting a work each year that resonates with the materials and utensils sold by his company, Viglietta Matteo SpA, a leader in the importation and wholesale distribution of hardware, which features a catalogue of 1,200 pages filled with various items. Once again this year, the work purchased at Artissima will not only become part of Collezione La Gaia but will also be featured on the cover of the "catalogue-pricelist". In this way, the work will connect with one of the hundreds of products or materials, while also paying homage to Matteo Viglietta's ironic and irreverent spirit – one characterized by an open mind and a contagious smile.

The Carol Rama Award, organized by Fondazione Sardi per-l'Arte and now in its fifth edition, will be awarded to the artist whose research and work embody the ideals of unconventional female creativity and artistic freedom as represented by Carol Rama through her work and personality. The selected artist will receive a grant of 2,500 euros to support their practice.

The prize is inspired by Pinuccia Sardi's passion for Carol Rama. The apartment at Via Napione 15, where Carol Rama lived and worked from the 1940s until her death in 2015, was a space that welcomed many personalities and artists. In 2016, it was recognized as an important national cultural asset and protected as an artist's studio. In 2019, the Fondazione Sardi per l'Arte acquired the complete contents of the residence from the artist's heirs and subsequently loaned them to Archivio Carol Rama, the current custodian. This initiative aims to transform the home-studio into a vibrant space for the knowledge and study of the painter's work, making it accessible to the public and researchers. This allows exploration of the creative independence of an artist who consistently eluded classification and challenged the stereotypes surrounding

THE INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORTS

The **Premio Diana Bracco – Imprenditrici ad arte** was established in 2023 thanks to a novel initiative organized by **Fondazione Bracco** in collaboration with **Fondazione Roberto De Silva e Diana Bracco** in Milano. This award focuses on recognizing the figure of a female gallerist as an entrepreneur. A jury of experts will select one rising woman gallerist, Italian or international, whose gallery has at least one location in Italy and whose entrepreneurial history reflects a strong commitment to artistic research and quality.

The prize underscores the gallerist's ability to combine commercial growth in the art market with meaningful cultural development aimed at supporting and promoting young artists. The winner will receive a cash prize of 10,000 euros, intended to further grow her entrepreneurial model in the contemporary art sector, thus serving as inspiration for new generations of Italian and international gallery entrepreneurs.

In line Fondazione Bracco's commitment to recognizing the expertise and contributions of women, the prize is part of a wider-ranging project aimed at reflecting on and studying the role of female entrepreneurs in the art world, developed in collaboration with II Giornale dell'Arte.

Interviews with the jurors and the winner of the 2024 prize, showcasing five entrepreneurial stories of passion and research, will be featured on the social media channels of Giornale dell'Arte and Artissima.

Established in 2023 in collaboration with Pinacoteca Agnelli, the Premio Pista 500 provides an artist with the opportunity to create a permanent artwork for a billboard on the track of the roof of the Lingotto, near Artissima. Pista 500 is a new project dedicated to site-specific art installations for the historic testing track of FIAT automobiles, which is now a spectacular panoramic promenade. During the fair, an international jury will select one artist who will have the opportunity to create a specific work for the billboard — a monumental poster featuring photographs, images, and other visual projects. The work will be unveiled during Artissima 2025. The award reflects the new direction taken by Pinacoteca Agnelli, transforming it into a dynamic centre open to multidisciplinary expressions of the present while maintaining a dialogue with the historic collection. The institution's mission includes fostering inclusion of diverse audiences, further supported by expanded programming in the spectacular spaces of Pista 500. The work by Chalisée Naamani, the winner in 2023, will be presented during Artissima 2024.

Fondazione Oelle promotes, for the third year, the Oelle - Mediterraneo Antico Prize, for which an international jury selects one artist represented by galleries in the fair. The selected artist will take part in a residency in Catania, aimed at producing a work that enhances the contemporary Sicilian and Mediterranean context. At the end of the residency, an exhibition will be organized and hosted in one of the Foundation's exhibition venues. This experimental format is dedicated to the "navigating artists" of the third millennium and is designed to enhance contemporary artistic research, particularly from the "South of the world". It encompasses various fields, including visual arts, photography, video, sound art, and more (such as literature) actions understood as cultural crossings in Sicily and the Mediterranean.

During the fair, the Oval's Sala Sospesa will host the works of Dala Nasser and Caroline Ricca Lee, winners at the fair of the Prize in previous editions 2022-23. The works in the exhibition will represent the outcome of the residencies held by the two artists in Sicily: on the one hand, Lebanese artist Dala Nasser's palimpsest of textiles made from yarns produced by a Sicilian company by transforming orange peels used in the production

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of fruit juices; on the other hand, the sculptures by Sino-Japanese-Brazilian artist Caroline Ricca Lee that, in the wake of a search between memory and identity, investigate the expressive potential of Etna's lava stone.

THE FUNDS

For 20 years, Fondazione per l'Arte Moderna e Contemporanea CRT, the operative body of Fondazione CRT, has been an active partner of Artissima. The foundation supports the fair through concrete initiatives, primarily acquisitions, believing that Artissima represents an extraordinary opportunity for the city of Torino to confirm and consolidate its role on the international stage. For the 31st edition of Artissima, the Fondazione per l'Arte Moderna e Contemporanea CRT increases its historic Acquisitions Fund for the second consecutive year, now reaching 280,000 euros. This fund will benefit the collections of GAM - Galleria Civica di Arte Moderna di Torino and Castello di Rivoli Museo d'Arte Contemporanea, representing the highest budget allocated in the last twelve years.

Over the years, through its acquisitions at Artissima, the Foundation has built an extensive collection of contemporary artworks, now considered one of the most prestigious collections nationally and internationally.

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The collection comprises over 930 pieces, ranging from painting to sculpture, video to photography, large installations to NFTs, produced by roughly 300 artists, with a total investment exceeding 41 million euros. The Expert Committee plays a key role in the foundation's acquisitions, working closely with the Directors and Head Curators of Castello di Rivoli Museo d'Arte Contemporanea and GAM - Galleria Civica d'Arte Moderna e Contemporanea to select works that further enhance the artistic heritage of both museums, which are centers of excellence in Piedmont and reference points for bringing art to a diverse national and international audience.

The Artissima New Entries Fund is directly supported by the fair to facilitate the participation of three galleries in the 2024 edition. This initiative is part of the three-year IDENTITY program, which began in 2023 and is developed by Artissima.

New Entries is the section that includes the most interesting exhibitors taking part in the fair for the first time, showcasing Artissima's international scouting expertise. The commitment of Artissima to engage in discovery of rising galleries and artists on the Italian and international scene has been a key factor of identity for the fair and its mission from the outset.

An international jury will assign the grant to three galleries in the New Entries section, chosen for the quality of their proposals for participation in the fair.
